Fieldwork, Reciprocal Indebtedness, and the Challenge of Long-term Commitments

Ethnographic fieldwork is a two-way process. In order to elicit reliable data, the anthropologist must establish rapport with members of the host community. That sometimes involves payment of "informant fees" or provision of other objects that the hosts value; it almost always requires expressions of mutual goodwill. In many cases, personal relationships are established, and anthropologists may spend decades seeking ways to recompense their erstwhile interlocutors whose kindness helped launch their careers. Those efforts, however, often encounter unanticipated hurdles. In this presentation, I will discuss a small scholarship fund that I established to assist young people from Anuta, a remote Polynesian community in the Solomon Islands, and the unexpected—sometimes humorous, frequently exasperating—obstacles which have made it surprisingly difficult for that initiative to achieve its long-sought objectives.
